

INTRODUCTION

The Association of Japan-Indonesia Veterinary Education (AJIVE) was established as a bilateral academic consortium dedicated to strengthening collaborative ties between veterinary institutions in Japan and Indonesia. Since its inception, AJIVE has served as a principal platform for the exchange of scientific knowledge, educational experiences, and professional expertise between the two nations, fostering a sustained network of researchers, educators, clinicians, and students committed to the advancement of veterinary medicine and animal health sciences.

The AJIVE International Symposium, held biennially, constitutes the flagship scholarly event of this association. Over the course of nine preceding symposia, the forum has grown considerably in both scope and participation, reflecting the deepening engagement of academic and professional communities across Indonesia and Japan. Each edition has provided a venue for the dissemination of original research, the discussion of emerging issues in veterinary science, and the cultivation of long-term institutional partnerships. The progression of themes across successive symposia mirrors the evolving priorities of the global veterinary and public health landscape.

The 10th AJIVE International Symposium marks a significant milestone in the history of this collaboration. Hosted by the Faculty of Medicine and Veterinary Medicine, Universitas Nusa Cendana, in Kupang, East Nusa Tenggara, Indonesia, this edition is convened under the theme "Strengthening AJIVE Collaboration in Sustaining Animal Health." The choice of Kupang as the venue for this landmark symposium is particularly meaningful, as the region represents a unique ecological and epidemiological context — situated at the intersection of diverse agricultural systems, wildlife habitats, and cross-border animal movement corridors — making it a pertinent setting for discussions on sustainable animal health strategies.

In recognition of the ongoing need for inclusive scientific engagement across geographical boundaries, the 10th AJIVE Symposium adopts a hybrid format, accommodating both on-site and online participation. This approach reflects the committee's commitment to broadening access to scientific discourse and ensuring that contributors from diverse institutional and geographic contexts are afforded the opportunity to present and engage with the research community.
